

**Academic Nephrologist – Clinician Teacher
University Health Network and University of Toronto**

The Department of Medicine at the University of Toronto and the University Health Network (UHN), Division of Nephrology, are seeking to hire an academic nephrologist with demonstrated excellence in research or medical education and expertise in chronic kidney disease, dialysis and glomerular disease management. The applicant will work alongside a vibrant multidisciplinary research and clinical team and will contribute in all aspects to perpetuate the Toronto GN Registry vision to provide excellence in patient care, research and teaching. The targeted start date is July 1st 2022 or shortly thereafter.

The applicant will have completed training in clinical nephrology and an MSc or equivalent training in epidemiology or biostatistics, post graduate training in clinical teaching and must be eligible for a full-time clinical academic appointment at the rank of Assistant, Associate, or Full Professor (rank) at the University of Toronto. The applicant will focus on glomerulonephritis-related clinical care and research and approximately 25% of time will be allocated to research scholarly work. The successful candidate must hold an MD degree, be eligible for certification by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in nephrology and have, or be eligible for licensure in Ontario.
