

Academic Nephrologist

The Department of Medicine, Faculty of Health Sciences at McMaster University and St. Joseph's Healthcare invite applicants for an Academic Nephrologist to join the Division of Nephrology as soon as March 1st, 2022.

The successful applicant will have a primary focus in general nephrology and dialysis, and will participate in both inpatient and outpatient programs. Clinical duties will include rotation through the MRP inpatient nephrology service that provides coverage for a mix of patients with kidney disease (including acute dialysis) at St. Joseph's Healthcare, as well as supervising a consult service at the other teaching hospital sites in Hamilton and/or Brantford for a total of approximately 10-13 weeks per year. Outpatient clinical service will include a balance of new consults and follow-ups of general nephrology patients, as well as longitudinal follow-up of dialysis patients at two to three sites. Opportunities are available to participate in sub-specialty clinics, including glomerulonephritis, hypertension or other specific areas of interest depending on the candidate's training. Candidates should bring training and experience in research, education, patient safety, innovation or clinical leadership to the Division and will be expected to outline a plan for successful promotion within the Department of Medicine at McMaster University in the Clinician-Educator stream.

The Division of Nephrology comprises 19 geographic full-time nephrologists and two PhD researchers who are engaged in clinical practice, education and research. The Division provides tertiary nephrology and renal transplantation care to the central-west region of Ontario. McMaster has a highly regarded nephrology residency training program and also offers additional fellowship training in a number of areas including transplantation, home dialysis, and glomerulonephritis. Successful HLA laboratory, renal pathology and clinical research programs provide an excellent academic atmosphere. The successful candidate will be a full-time member of the Division of Nephrology and will be expected to contribute to the academic mission of the Faculty of Health Sciences and the Division.

Applicants should be certified, or eligible for certification in Nephrology, by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. Candidates must have an MD or equivalent and must be eligible for licensure in the province of Ontario.

Expressions of interest should include:

- A curriculum vitae
- Description of training
- Submit a brief statement describing any contributions made or planned in relation to advancing equity, diversity and inclusion or inclusive excellence in teaching, research or service within higher education, community-based or other profession settings (2-page maximum)
- Provide the names and contact information of three professional referees; letters of reference are not required and will not be reviewed at the application stage; the Department will request letters of recommendation from referees at later stages of the search process.

All qualified applicants are encouraged apply; however, Canadian citizens and permanent residents will be considered first for this position. To comply with the Government of Canada's reporting requirements, the University is obliged to gather information about applicants' status as either Permanent Residents of Canada or Canadian citizens. Applicants need not identify their country of origin or current citizenship; however, all

applications must include one of the following statements: “Yes, I am a citizen or permanent resident of Canada” or “No, I am not a citizen or permanent resident of Canada”
