<u>The University Health Network – Fellowship in Cardiovascular,</u> Renal, Endocrinology & Metabolic Diseases

The University Health Network, University of Toronto is accepting applications for a Fellowship in Cardiovascular, Renal, Endocrinology and Metabolic Diseases. The University Health Network has large Divisions of Nephrology, Cardiology and Endocrinology & Metabolism, with diverse clinical and research areas of expertise. Since July 2014, the Divisions of Nephrology, Cardiology and Endocrinology & Metabolism at the University Health Network have collaborated to form a combined Cardiology-Renal-Endocrine ("CaRE") clinical program, serving patients with diabetes and cardiovascular and/or renal complications. The present clinical fellowship program aims to extend the clinical training of recently graduated nephrology trainees to:

- 1. Enhance integrated care of patients with diabetes and renal and/or cardiovascular disease.
- 2. Encourage trainees who have an interest in diabetes-related clinical research; and
- 3. Increase clinical and research capacity in Canada in this area.

Areas of specific focus will include diabetic nephropathy, cardiovascular and peripheral vascular diseases, glycemic management in patients with type 1 and type 2 diabetes, dietary modification, management of diabetes in patients on dialysis. A strong focus will also be placed on translational research. Salary will be approximately \$75,000 CDN per annum and support to attend conferences will also be considered to present trainee's work.

Successful candidates will be fluent in English, have completed clinical training in nephrology, endocrinology or cardiology and be eligible for an educational license as an internal medicine specialist in the province of Ontario (minimum of 4 years of residency training following medical school).

Outstanding and qualified applicants are encouraged to apply, regardless of their current country of residence, but preference may be given to Canadian applicants. The starting date and duration for fellowships is flexible. Acceptance of new applications may be paused without notice based on the number of applications received.
