



Physician Clinical Associate – Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre; Department of Medicine; Division of Nephrology

The Division of Nephrology at Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre is seeking applicants for a Clinical Associate. The position is a one-year contract with possible renewal. We are seeking newly trained graduates from Nephrology Fellowships who have an independent practice license for Ontario, Canada.

Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre is academic teaching hospital, fully affiliated with the University of Toronto. The clinical associate will be primarily responsible for attending on in-patient ward and consultation services, with some limited dialysis coverage.

The associate will be on-call as a staff physician on nights and weekends in rotation with other staff nephrologists. The services are supported by Medicine trainees and Nephrology trainees. There are opportunities for teaching and projects related to quality improvement and research.

We will also provide support for advanced training including Masters Degrees. Prior candidates have been generally been successful at securing staff positions in the Greater Toronto Area, at both in academic and community centres.
