

The University of British Columbia Division of Nephrology in collaboration with Providence Health Care and Vancouver General Hospital Divisions of Nephrology is seeking academic physician applicants for nephrology positions in our renal programs, serving diverse populations across the spectrum of CKD. The UBC and Hospital divisions are part of a provincial program with outreach programs and serving as centres of excellence for specific conditions.

We are seeking applicants with expertise in the evaluation and management of complex kidney populations, and commitment to development of academic and educational outputs for the benefit of patients living in BC, and their care providers. Applicants should be committed to the advancement kidney care, and preferably have advanced post-nephrology training in a specific domain related kidney disease, health systems redesign, quality improvement, administration, or other relevant areas.

Applicants must have an M.D. or MD./Ph.D degree or equivalent and certified in Internal Medicine and Nephrology by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, with additional training and experience in an area of special interest. Applicants must be eligible to be licensed and in good standing with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of British Columbia.

Clinical responsibilities include providing clinical care for patients in both the inpatient and outpatient services as a nephrologist, working within the existing provincial networks. Participation in local and provincial Interdisciplinary team meetings, education and research are expected, in accordance with specific areas of expertise.

Research and scholarship responsibilities can be supported, and resources include access to robust statistical teams, methodologists, and databases. The candidate is expected to develop and maintain academic activities of benefit to all including quality improvement and/ or administrative programs. Exposure to medical students, residents, nephrology fellows in various stages of training, is an expected component. The role includes participation in clinical, education and academic activities.

The successful applicant will be based at PHC or VGH predominantly, with the potential for some cross site activities, as well as provincial responsibilities as developed in conjunction with existing infrastructures for both clinical and academic activities.

UBC Division of Nephrology, as part of UBC, hires based on merit and is committed to employment equity. All qualified persons are encouraged to apply. Equity and diversity are essential to academic excellence. An open and diverse community fosters the inclusion of voices that have been underrepresented or discouraged. We encourage applications from members of groups that have been marginalized on any grounds enumerated under the B.C. Human Rights Code, including sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression,

racialization, disability, political belief, religion, marital or family status, age, and/or status as a First Nation, Metis, Inuit, or Indigenous person.

All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority


