

Hereditary Kidney Disease (HKD) Fellowship Training Program

The Division of Nephrology at the University Health Network in Toronto will be accepting applications for the 2022-2023 HKD Fellowship Training Program. This 12-month fellowship is fully accredited through the Department of Medicine at the University of Toronto. This fellowship will enable the successful candidate to acquire clinical expertise in the diagnosis and treatment of HKD with a major focus on autosomal dominant polycystic kidney disease (ADPKD).

Objectives:

- Fostering expertise in the clinical care of patients with hereditary kidney disease
- Develop expertise in genetic testing of hereditary kidney disease
- Develop expertise in mutation- and kidney imaging-based prognostication in ADPKD
- Participate in at least one clinical research project related to ADPKD

Prerequisite Training: Interested applicants must have completed at least two years of general nephrology training from an accredited program in Canada or abroad.

Salary: Compensation will be equivalent to the PGY6 salary as outlined by PARO (see here for details <https://myparo.ca/starting-residency/#salary-and-benefits>).

2. An updated CV
3. Names of three references

The successful applicant will be notified by February 15th, 2022 the latest and the expected start date will be July 4th, 2022.
