Committee review of local and emerging national network to optimize survey distribution and response rate.	
The Committee reviewed and discussed a variety of ways to distribute the survey and raised the following key points:	
 Reaching out to personal and professional networks across Canada. Promotion by the CSN on their website and via several timed eBlasts and reminders. A direct email to Nephrology Program and Division Directors. Sharing via existing allied groups such as CANNT, CST, CAPN, RPN, dietitians, pharmacists. Provincial nephrology organizations such as the ORN. Local hospital departments / colleagues. CSN social media channels. 	
The Committee also discussed the logistics of using signage and providing the survey on computers used for charting in dialysis units.	
The final deadline for the survey will be April 15, 2023 and as such, it will be important to send at least 2 - 3 reminders on a regular basis.	
Dr. Sandal mentioned that the usual survey response rate is about 10% for physicians. This figure increases slightly when an incentive is offered. Ideally, surveys should not take more than 10 minutes to complete.	
QR codes were also recommended as a way to access the survey.	
Ideally, some preliminary survey results will be available for the May CSN AGM.	
5. ISN Emerging Leaders Collaborators - Project Status Report	
This group includes a diverse group of representatives from 11 different countries (with 2 members from Canada) including Australia, Italy, the UK, Uganda, Nigeria, Egypt and others. Each country brings a unique perspective and a variety of different issues, for example, in Africa, where dialysis availability and means to optimally dispose of clinical waste are limited.	
The group is conducting three main projects with a focus on green nephrology:	
 A scoping review of the literature on green nephrology. A needs assessment survey.

Tentative title : The knowledge, attitude and practice assessment of health professionals in nephrology on climate change, renal care, and sustainability.	
Aims:	
 To understand the knowledge and attitude of health professionals in nephrology on climate change and kidney care. To identify current and possible practices on sustainability and barriers to implementation. To compare responses by a country's income level and CO2 emissions per capita.

Dr. Glavinovic reported that this scoping review is focusing on environmental metrics in publications within the Healthcare LCA database , and how this information is being reported and measured. CASCADES will be organizing this information with an intention of producing an infographic 'Environmental Literacy for the Clinician'.	
The articles in this database pertaining to kidney care will help inform Dr. Rajan's future CJKHD article describing and including a kidney care Life cycle assessment. Dr. Stigant pointed out the incredible cost of health damages as determined by equivalent financial cost of DALYs originating from LCA data obtained at system level for one year of hemodialysis treatment, as recently reported in an article from a Japanese medical journal.
